Explanation of Responses:

1. Convertible, on a share-for-share basis, into Class A Common Stock.

2. Option granted pursuant to Company's 1992 Stock Option Plan as incentive to remain in employ of Company.

3. Fully exercisable.

4. Option granted in an exempt transaction as incentive to remain in employ of Company.

5. The option is not exercisable unless the market price of Class A Common Stock reaches \$48 per share while the optionee is employed by the Company or a subsidiary. When the target price is achieved, the option becomes exercisable as to a number of shares determined by multiplying 25,000 times the number of full years that have elapsed since the grant date. Thereafter, the option becomes exercisable as to an additional 25,000 shares on each anniversary of the grant date while the optionee remains an employee. In the event of termination of the optionee's employment, the option terminates as to all shares as to which it is not then exercisable, except that, in the case of voluntary termination after age 62, death, disability or involuntary termination, if the target price has been achieved prior to such termination, the option becomes exercisable, immediately prior to such termination, as to one-half of the shares as to which it is not then exercisable.

6. Restricted Stock Units granted pursuant to the Albany International Corp. 2003 Restricted Stock Unit Plan (the "Restricted Stock Unit Plan"). Each Restricted Stock Unit entitles the holder to receive the cash equivalent of one share of Class A Common Stock at the time of vesting or, in the event that the holder elects to defer payment, at such later time elected in accordance with the Restricted Stock Unit Plan.

7. 1,500 Restricted Stock Units (plus related dividend units) vest on each November 11, beginning November 11, 2005.

8. Includes dividend units accrued on Restricted Stock Units on January 8, 2009.

9. Restricted Stock Units granted on February 16, 2007 pursuant to the Albany International Corp. 2005 Incentive Plan (the "Incentive Plan"). Each Restricted Stock Unit award entitles the holder to receive a number of shares of Class A Common Stock, the cash equivalent of such shares, or a combination of cash and shares, in each case in accordance with a settlement schedule.

10. The remaining reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on or about March 1, 2009, half in cash, half in shares of the Company's Class A Common Stock.

11. Restricted Stock Units granted on February 15, 2008 pursuant to the Albany International Corp. 2005 Incentive Plan (the "Incentive Plan"). Each Restricted Stock Unit award entitles the holder to receive a number of shares of Class A Common Stock, the cash equivalent of such shares, or a combination of cash and shares, in each case in accordance with a settlement schedule.

12. Two-thirds of the remaining reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on or about March 1, 2009, and the remaining balance of the reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on our about March 1, 2010. Each of the 2009 and 2010 payments will be half in cash, half in shares of the Company's Class A Common Stock.

13. 8,000 Restricted Stock Units (plus related dividend units) vest on March 1, 2011; 8,000 Restricted Stock Units (plus related dividend units) vest on September 1, 2011; 8,000 Restricted Stock Units (plus related dividend units) vest on March 1, 2012; and 8,000 Restricted Stock Units (plus related dividend units) vest on September 1, 2012.

14. Restricted Stock Units granted on February 27, 2009 pursuant to the Albany International Corp. 2005 Incentive Plan (the "Incentive Plan"). Each Restricted Stock Unit award entitles the holder to receive a number of shares of Class A Common Stock, the cash equivalent of such shares, or a combination of cash and shares, in each case in accordance with a settlement schedule.

15. 25% of the reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on or about March 1, 2009, (b) 50% of the reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on or about March 1, 2010, and (c) the final 25% of the reported units (plus related dividend units) will be settled and payable on or about March 1, 2011. The 2009 payment will be all in cash, while each of the 2010 and 2011 payments will be half in cash, half in shares of the Company's Class A Common Stock.
